

How Many People Receive Supports and Services from Intellectual or Developmental Disability State Agencies?

Disability and IDD Prevalence

An estimated 12.6% of the U.S. population had a disability in 2015 (Kraus, 2017).

The Residential Information Systems Project estimates 2.3% of the U.S. population have an intellectual disability, autism spectrum disorder or a developmental disability in 2016 (Larson et al, 2018).

People with IDD who Receive Services from State IDD Agencies

380 people per 100,000 of the population receive services from State IDD Agencies. This is 0.38% of the U.S. population.

17% of people with IDD receive long-term supports and services (LTSS) from their state IDD agency.

People with IDD living in Community Settings

314 people per 100,000 lived in a community or *individualized settings.

14% of people with IDD live in community or *individualized settings while receiving state IDD Agency LTSS

* Individualized settings have 3 or fewer people with IDD

People with IDD living in group or institutional settings

67 people per 100,000 lived in a group setting of 4 or more people or an institution

2.9% of people with IDD live in group setting of 4 or more people or an institution while receiving state IDD Agency LTSS
